Doreen Chan (b.1987, Hong Kong) is a mixed-media artist focusing on social practice. She was trained in visual communication and photography before receiving her MA in Art Education from School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2021. In her work, Chan re-examines the tensions between interpersonal relationships and subject formation. Through collecting, selecting, and reorganizing fragments from everyday life, she explores how individuals interact with collective and personal memories. She works site-specifically on installations, public programs, virtual projects, and collaborates with a wide range of individuals using images, sculptures, objects, sounds, and performance.

Chan has exhibited in institutions such as Ars Electronica Festival 2022 (Linz), UCCA Center for Contemporary Art (Beijing), Times Museum (Guangzhou), Art Omi (New York), and Para Site (Hong Kong). In 2023, her commissioned project, Sipping Dreams, inaugurated Tai Kwun Contemporary's V Hall. In the same year, she was listed as ArtReview China's Future Greats. Nelise Nasheida Charles is a textile designer, artist, living and creating in Brooklyn, NY. Born in Saint George's, Grenada, raised in Flatbush her work seeks to bring attention to the beauty and complexity of the natural world through the juxtaposition of patterns in fabric, dyes and silkscreen. Using a variety of natural fibers, generally silk, linen and cotton, she creates intricate prints that conjure traditional motifs and evoke the vibrancy of nature. Her pieces are experimental in nature and embrace roots, petals, leaves and even some insects as symbols of the delicate yet powerful interconnectivity found in the environment. Through her work, Nelise aims to challenge traditional art historical narrative and provoke questions concerning the relationship between people and nature. Her vibrant work speaks to the importance of utilizing colors and textures to communicate stories that are too often untold.

She attended the Nikoladze School of Arts and earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts and Theater Arts degree from the Tbilisi State Academy of Arts in 2007. She holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the School of Visual Arts in New York. Lee Jensen creates contemporary art quilts for the wall and sewn textile pieces. Her work is influenced by her urban environment and by her background working as a graphic designer for the textile industry in New York City. Her patchwork compositions are improvised pieces, created from reclaimed and repurposed fabric remnants. Each piece is created through a dialogue with the materials and is quilted by hand. Lee's work evokes both time-honored craft traditions, as well as a contemporary graphic expression through her exploration of color and composition. Lee has exhibited in several group gallery shows in NYC and she is a member of the Textile Study Group of New York.

Her prints, videos, paintings, and installations feature mythical creatures: non-human proxies that simulate the human experience. Inspired by nature and literature, she reinterprets animals' and plants' characteristics and anatomical images to create virtual creatures. Using anthropomorphic creatures, she makes sociopolitical observations and metaphorically illustrates various elements of the contemporary world. Her artistic practice aims to emancipate ourselves from the dominant narrative of society and highlight the imaginative possibilities that reside within each individual.
